## **Day Care Centers**

Emunah's child care network encompasses some 135 day care centers throughout Israel, including multi-purpose centers that provide shelter and dedicated care to children from disadvantaged families.

The educational programs provided at Emunah facilities reflect Jewish tradition and heritage. The children are given nutritious meals. Emunah programs are government supervised.

# Children's Homes

Emunah's residential family units, therapeutic homes, after-school programs, and study centers are part of a comprehensive system of support, empowerment, and welfare that Emunah provides for children and teens who lack supportive family backing. Crisis Centers protect children and teenage girls at risk to break the cycle of distress.

Our residential children's homes are operated by outstanding professional staff and offer our young people a broad range of opportunities, preparing them for eventual integration into society, the army, and gainful employment.


## High Schools and College

Emunah's system of secondary and higher education offers modern Orthodox teenage girls a choice of study disciplines: computers and art, technology and science, music and graphics, fashion and engineering, and more Although not all students are from religious homes, they enjoy a Torah-oriented education, while actively contributing to the community through voluntary work.

Emunah's College in Jerusalem offers academic degrees in visual media, theater and art, and equips graduates with the knowledge and skills required for a productive and creative professional life in their chosen fields.

# Training Institute

# Local Chapters and Midrashot

The organizational foundation of Emunah, Israel's largest modern Orthodox movement, is comprised of 26 affiliates throughout the country. These constitute the heart of the organization's day-to-day activities and offer cultural activities; outings, lectures, and study days; and also oversee Emunah's communitybased volunteer work and charity enterprises. Affiliated with Emunah branches, a widespread network of midrashot, or study centers, are a pleasant setting for women to study Bible, Jewish law, and Jewish thought.

### Women's Empowerment

Emunah takes a prominent role in public endeavors aimed at empowering observant women, enhancing their inclusion in community life, and expanding their spheres of influence. Its representatives are active in women's organizations, Knesset committees, education and welfare agencies, boards of directors and business firms, local municipalities, and more, and provide support to business women. These activities are also manifested in public and legal battles, support of legislation, and various publications.

#### **National Service**

Together with the Aluma non-profit organization, Emunah takes an active part in operating Israel's National Service, integrating thousands of young people in volunteer settings in Israel and in schools around the Jewish world. Their joint enterprise, Bat Ami, administers volunteers deployed in welfare and educational institutions, and in providing assistance to needy populations.
