# About Emunah



Since 1935, Emunah of America has provided crucial support to thousands of Israelis. Emunah is dedicated to caring for the most vulnerable children and families in Israel through the operation of numerous programs across the country. These programs encompass 5 children's homes for youth at risk, 13 counseling centers, 110 day care centers, including 5 multi-purpose day care centers, 3 crisis centers, 4 high schools, and an arts college.

Emunah is a catalyst for social change helping to alleviate the burden of Israel's social problems. Emunah of America raises essential funds to support educational and social welfare programs aimed at strengthening the Jewish family and advancing women's status.

## **Children's Homes**

Our homes provide a safe and stable living environment for children who, for various reasons, cannot live with their biological families. These homes are staffed by trained professionals who offer a warm and nurturing atmosphere to ensure the children's physical, emotional and psychological well being. By providing therapeutic treatments, as well as educational and social enrichment opportunities, the children develop self esteem, work toward realizing their full potential, and become full contributors to society. We continually observe tremendous success with our graduates who serve in the IDF, volunteer in National Service or continue to higher academic studies.

## **Day Care Centers**

Our day care centers provide a structured environment where children can learn, play and socialize in a supervised setting while their primary caregiver may be unavailable or at work. Children receive early childhood education and care within an engaging Jewish environment. **The multi-purpose day care centers** identify developmental or behavioral concerns and provide early interventional support to vulnerable, at-risk children in addition to providing parental education and guidance.

## **Counseling Centers**

Our counseling centers, located throughout the country, provide local communities with the psychological resources to deal with personal challenges. These centers offer a range of services with various types of therapy, at subsidized costs, to address mental health concerns including anxiety, depression, stress, grief, trauma, addiction and many behavioral problems. Today, as the general population suffers with mental health consequences from the October 7 attack and the ensuing war, the need is greater than ever, and our facilities have shifted to accommodate the increased demand for these support services.

## Crisis Centers

Emunah has a Women's Shelter, Teenage Girl's Crisis Center, and a Children's Emergency Crisis Center. Psychologists, social workers, and general staff evaluate and plan individual treatment programs in specific settings. Typically, individuals arrive with extreme and complicated circumstances. Our objective is to provide comprehensive support to cope and build self-sufficiency.

## Emunah Appleman College for Arts and Technology

The college has grown into a unique academic institution, boasting over 500 students. The college is a place of higher learning where an observant young woman can earn a degree in fine arts, graphic design or theater studies while remaining in a religious atmosphere. The four year program of career-based studies enables these young women to use their skills to become experts in their chosen field and become financially independent and productive citizens. Our students are renowned for their talent, having garnered multiple national and international awards and are indeed sought after to exhibit their work and for employment by private companies and public institutions throughout Israel. The College houses the Charlotte Dachs Mechina Program that offers high school dropouts a final chance at success. With heavy emphasis on counseling, tutoring, and individualized education, the girls are guided through the coursework and curriculum requirements to pass their matriculation exams, an absolute requirement for higher education or any advanced employment.

## High Schools

Our high schools are dedicated to empowering over a thousand young women by offering both educational and social stimulation. Our primary goal is to support teenage development, focusing on their psychological, emotional, and social well-being and also providing vocational training programs and support for teenagers at risk. Our dedicated teachers and staff strive to enable each student to reach her highest academic potential while simultaneously fostering meaningful relationships within a religious and Zionist setting.

## Promoting the Status of Women

Emunah promotes the elevated status of women by running programs to build a woman's self-reliance, positive self-image, and inner strength. With the aim of overcoming conflict, we provide tools and support for women who are confronting abusive and violent circumstances. Emunah also runs a pre-army academy (*mechina*) which teaches skills to young women, instilling confidence and a strong mindset, preparing them not only for their army service but also for life beyond. In addition, Emunah is engaged in social activism in the protection of women on an ongoing basis and is significantly involved in the fight for Jewish women's rights in the aftermath of the October 7th massacre.

# Israel at War

In response to the increased demand for support, Emunah immediately recruited additional therapists, increased therapy hours provided by our existing staff, and expanded care to meet the growing need. Your support enables us to reach and assist more people and offer vital emergency support to additional Israelis who require it. Emunah sought out ways to provide immediate help throughout the country in response to a country at war.

In Jerusalem, the [Florence and Joseph Appleman College of Arts and Technology](#) is hosting almost 50 national service volunteers (Bnot Sherut Leumi) from Sderot who are unable to return to their place of service since the town is closed.

In Bnei Brak, [Emunah's High School and Boarding School Neve Sara Herzog](#) hosted 70 adults and children – families whose homes have been destroyed or have been evacuated.

In Netanya, The [Emunah Bet Elazraki](#) kitchen prepares hundreds of nutritious meals every day for the evacuees, members of Kibbutz Mefalsim, who are being hosted in Netanya.

In Pardes Chana, The [Emunah Neve Michael Children's Home](#) hosted 100 evacuees from Kibbutz Alumim near Gaza for a special carnival and fun day.

In Afula, members of the [Emunah Community Chapter](#) prepared gift baskets and food packages for soldiers serving on the nearby border with Jenin.





The **Emunah Chapter in Jerusalem** continues to arrange activities for evacuees from Sderot uprooted from their homes and are currently housed in Jerusalem hotels (providing cosmetic treatments, babysitting, etc).

Every therapist from **Emunah Counseling Centers** is busy providing nonstop support and trauma counseling for evacuees in person, on the phone, and via Zoom in all 13 counseling centers across Israel.

**Emunah Day Care Center** caregivers are in daily contact with families, many of whom have been evacuated to alternative locations from the North and South of Israel. Caregivers and social workers, some of whom have themselves been evacuated, speak to parents to offer support and comfort, interact with children over Zoom, and provide them with videos and respite materials.

**Emunah Neve Landy Children's Home** in Even Shmuel is only 23 miles from Gaza. The home was evacuated and the children were placed at host families outside of the danger zone. Emunah staff, national service volunteers, and therapists worked long hours, visiting the children and maintaining contact with them in order to ensure their well-being.

**Additional monthly therapy hours**




**Cost of additional therapy costs (since October 7th)**

## **Yad Yemin Fund**

The Yad Yemin Wedding Fund, which was established by Barbara and Gerald Schreck, provides financial support to cover the costs of weddings and the first stages of married life for Emunah graduates. Rivka Ben Shusan, a newlywed graduate from Achuzat Sara was a recent beneficiary of the Yad Yemin Fund. Rivka thanked Emunah and the Schreck family ***“From the bottom of my heart for the generous support you have given to us to begin our lives together.”***



## **The Jonas Erlich Dental Fund**

The Jonas Erlich Dental Fund was established by the Spitalnik and Steigman families. This year, 14 children were able to receive orthodontic treatment thanks to this fund. Yariv, one of the children, was brought to an emergency crisis center in the spring of 2016 due to violence at home, and after a few months was placed at Achuzat Sara. At school, Yariv experienced difficulties integrating socially and was conscious of the malformation of his teeth, which eroded his confidence, preventing him from engaging with his peers. After extensive dental treatment, his personal discomfort was reduced and his self-worth improved. He started speaking and interacting more with other students and his teachers. ***“The dental treatment has changed my life: Finally, I feel confident enough to make friends and spend time with them. I am also encouraged to improve my grades and join the group of good students at school.”*** -Yariv



## **The Spitalnick Visionary Fund**

The Visionary Fund aims to support the work of Emunah in Israel with a specific focus on innovative therapeutic and educational services. The Fund recognizes the essential role that therapy plays in the life of Emunah children and families, and especially supports programs that are not funded or insufficiently funded by government sources.

# Surviving Struggles: Noam's Story of Resilience

When Noam from Netivot was 11 years old, his father was sentenced to 9 years in an Israeli prison for trying to import narcotics from Turkey. Noam's mother, a drug addict herself, abandoned her 5 children, aged 3-11, and her aging parents in nearby Ofakim and disappeared. The grandparents, who had their own health issues, tried hard to care for their grandchildren. They were soon overwhelmed and problems mounted.

Noam, in particular, began to display maladaptive behavior and soon dropped out of school and started spending time with older boys, one of whom abused Noam repeatedly. Noam became increasingly angry and disruptive, and after he was found to have violently injured a neighbor's dog, child protective services placed Noam at the Emunah Neve Landy Children's Village in Even Shmuel. Noam received therapy to overcome his behavioral problems and tutoring to help him catch up in school. All of this took place in 2021, and since then Noam settled in and began to show significant improvement. He returned to school, made up the gaps and calmed down.

With the commitment and attention of the staff at Emunah Neve Landy, Noam was back on the path of success and accomplishment.

Noam's relationship with his grandparents greatly improved and he now spends Shabbatot and holidays with them and his siblings.

Unfortunately, on **October 7**, Noam was visiting his grandparents' home when Hamas terrorists entered **Ofakim** and shot people in cold blood. Although Noam told people only much later, it turned out that he was watching through the window and witnessed the terrorists in real-time.

Noam returned to Neve Landy soon after the incidents in a fragile state. Most of the time, he still refuses to leave his bedroom, wets his bed at night, and cries a great deal.

Staff identified the trauma, but it took many weeks before he began to share what he personally witnessed. Noam needs three therapy sessions per week for the foreseeable future to help regain some of his confidence and work through the horrific scene he experienced.

Emunah therapists are acutely aware that children who have experienced neglect or abuse are particularly vulnerable to developing PTSD following traumatic situations, such as the terror attacks in Israel. Their vulnerability and diminished emotional resilience, disrupted attachments, and eroded trust make the impact even more profound.



Immediate interventional therapy to address dire emotional needs and to prevent escalation of symptoms is critical.

**Emunah serves as the primary support system and functions as a family for these children. It is our duty to ensure their well-being and recovery.**

#### The Emergency Fund: An Immediate Response to October 7th

The Emunah Emergency Fund was created as an immediate response to the horrific attacks of October 7th. These funds are allocated to support therapeutic interventions at Emunah Therapy Centers, the installation of emergency power generators at Neve Landy and Afula Children's Homes, trauma counseling services at Emunah high schools, professional development training in therapeutic and trauma counseling for Emunah's staff, and the enhancement of security measures at Neve Landy, including the installation of new security gates.






